

Client32 v3.2x – Automatically saving the last login username

Long time users of Novell NetWare will be adversely surprised to find that when they upgrade to the latest **Windows 95/98** client from Novell, **Client v3.2x**, the login username field on the Novell Login screen no longer gets updated with the login name of the last user to successfully login on that PC.

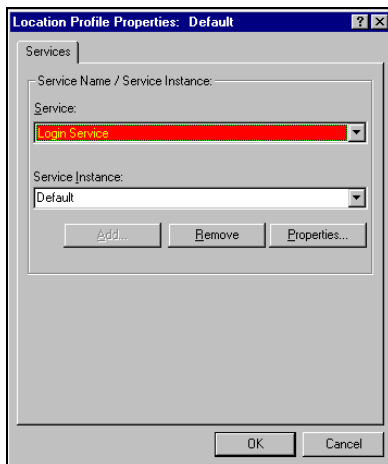
For instance, if the last user to have used a particular PC under a previous client was **“Michel”**, then, after having installed version 3.2x of the Novell Client, you will find that every time you login to the network, the username is always Michel, regardless of who you logged in as on your last login.

Why some programmer at Novell changed the **default behaviour** baffles us. Needless to say, however, that this can be utterly confusing and perplexing for users. Fortunately, however, it is possible to make the Novell Client v3.2x behave like its predecessors, and relatively easily :

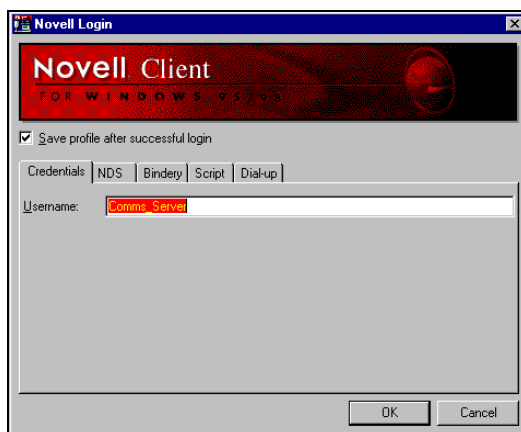
Changing Client32 v3.2x's default behaviour (Windows 95/98)

- Start \ Settings \ Control Panel \ Network.**
- Look at the Properties of the **Novell NetWare Client**.
- Click on the Location Profiles tab.
- Click on your location, which in most cases will simply be **“Default”**.
- Click on the Properties button to view the properties of the **“Default”** location profile.

- You will now get a screen like the one shown below. Make sure that you are looking at the **Login Service** of the “Default” location profile (or whichever profile you are looking at), as illustrated below :



- Click on the Properties button. The screen below should come up :



- Put a tick in **Save profile after successful login**.
- Click **OK** all the way back to the Control Panel.
- **You're done.** From now on, every time the Novell logon screen comes up, it will display the username of the last person who logged in successfully at this PC using the default profile.
